Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself; and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all. *What Happens Next*

**A Traveler’s Guide through the End of This Age**

Are we living in the end times? If so, what does that mean for us? In this video series, Max Lucado's optimistic, accessible, and non-sensational guide to what the Bible says about heaven's timeline will empower us to face the future with faith.

Seven years of chaos called the Tribulation. A cruel and cunning Antichrist. The dreaded battle of Armageddon. These images and ideas associated with prophecy can be stimulating but also unnecessarily scary. Max Lucado believes God wants us to be prepared, not scared.
