John 6:18-20

Dear People of St. Andrew's,

One of the oldest metaphors of the Church is a boat. You'll find the image throughout the early church. And where is a boat meant to be? On the land? No. In the harbor? No. The boat is meant to be out in the middle of the sea! Sailing, riding the waves, looking for new horizons, going on adventures, fishing for new people!

You know where the worst place is for a ship to be in the midst of a storm? Hugging the harbor. While a boat needs to harbor once in a while to refuel and stock up on supplies, during a storm if the ship remains in the harbor, it will crash against the rocks and the shore and be pulverized to bits. The place for a ship during a storm is riding the high seas.

To be a Jesus follower is to ride the waves of the Spirit in all kinds of weather, knowing that Jesus is there with you in the boat, that Jesus is near, whether walking on the water toward you, or sleeping there beside you.

One of the earliest metaphors for the tradition of the church is the anchor. But the anchor described in Hebrews 6 is not used to pull the boat back or keep it from moving. The anchor is used when the wind is high and the storm is raging to pull the boat forward. It's called kedging. You throw the anchor out in front of the boat, then pull the rope, so that the boat can move forward during the storm and escape crashing on the shore.

Jesus is like the anchor for us. Always steady and sure even when we are not, he pulls us forward during the storms of life, always leading us into peace even when around us the winds are roaring and the waves are threatening. Jesus pulls us toward the future.

You see, Jesus' peace is a peace within. On our own, we falter and fall. But with Jesus beside us and within us and among us, we are always sure to survive every turbulence.

We all waver when we believe we are doing life all alone. It's frightening, even for the best of us.

But faith is knowing that God has hold of your boat, even in the wildest of rides. Faith is knowing your life is always in the hands of Jesus, even when life blinds you and deafens you.

We, the Church, need to sail the seas too. Sometimes, the boat will rock. And that's okay. Because Jesus is here.

As long as the Church has Jesus at the helm, there is nothing to fear going out there in any kind of weather, in any kind of storm.

So the question is, do you know that Jesus is in the boat?

Because a church cannot "do" Jesus. You have to be in relationship with Jesus! You can't be the Church of Christ, if Christ is missing.

The good news is that Jesus is never missing. Sometimes we miss him. Sometimes, we fail to see him, or don't recognize him. Sometimes, we ignore him, or deny him, or discard him.

But look behind you, look around you. Jesus is right there, holding on to you.

The Coast Guard has an unofficial motto: "We have to go out. We don't have to come back." Why is that not the unofficial motto of every church in mission?

Put your hands into the waters and splash some onto your face, wipe your face with the towel. Cleanse away all of your fear. Cleanse away all of your doubt.

What remains when you emerge --that's faith.

Go - in faith - to sail the seas of the Spirit!

#### A Bible Study on the C.S. Lewis Book The Screwtape Letters

*The Screwtape Letters* provides unique insight into the battles that are being waged in the spiritual world. The story is told through a collection of letters from Screwtape, an undersecretary in the lower hierarchy of Hell, to his incompetent nephew, Wormwood. Wormwood is a junior devil who has just been given his first human, a young man, to corrupt and secure for eternity. The story takes place in England during the tumultuous years of World War II with the man contemplating Christianity.

As we walk through each letter, we will hear questions that bring out turns and twists in the thoughts and emotions that we each experience and that Lewis wanted us to recognize. Each session is self-contained, so you need not worry if you cannot attend all the sessions! If you do not already have a copy of the book, it can be purchased on-line for under \$10.

# **May Vestry Meeting Highlights**

#### **RECTOR'S REPORT**

As of 5/13/24, there was \$206,012 in ops account and \$76,959 in the parish reserve account.

As of 4/30/24, there was 26,826 in the Foundation's checking account – monies available to the vestry.

Total available funds from principal for years 2020 thru 2024: \$383,377.

There was 3,143,296 in the Foundation principal as of 3/15/24 (as opposed to 3,092,638 at the end of 2022, an increase of 50,658 for the year).

There is also \$119,139 in the Dan Curtis fund fbo St. Andrew's within the Community Foundation of Tampa Bay. This fund is designated for church maintenance purposes. Current amount available is \$12,896. But we are spending \$9,582 of that to repair leaks in the church roof, leaving us with about 3K for the rest of this year.

Pictorial Directory – Pam is adding names to the new directory, which will be up and running very soon.

Planned Giving – The Foundation Board would like for the parish to begin a serious effort at promoting planned giving. They plan on putting out planned giving brochures to all parishioners and would like to have an estate attorney come and address the parish. A legacy society can then be established from the people who have named St. Andrew's in their wills.

Memorial Service – for Steve Rosser (former vestryman and choir section leader) was on Saturday, 4/27 at 2PM at St. Andrew's.

Parish Picnic – was Sunday, 4/28. Many thanks to Jan & Earl Smith for hosting once again and to Parish Life for set-up/take-down and to Martha Cobb and Bill Nipper for grilling! Great turnout!

Memorial Service – for Nancy Honeycutt (mother of Catherine Straz) was on Saturday, 5/4 at 11AM at St. Andrew's.

Cinco de Mayo - luncheon was on Cinco de Mayo, Sunday, May  $5^{th}$  after the 10:30 service. Many thanks to the Outreach Committee for hosting this event. We filled the parish hall with about 80 folks and raised around \$800 for Operation Smart Start!

Graduate/Sunday School Sunday – is during the 10:30 service on 5/19. We will recognize our high school and college graduates and thank our Sunday School teachers.

Scuba Vacation Bible School – will be the week of 8/5 through 8/9 from 9AM-Noon at St. Andrew's.

Vestry Retreat – is Saturday, 9/7 at DaySpring. Plan on meeting from 9AM until 3PM.

#### Senior Warden:

Piers is out of town.

#### Junior Warden:

\* Roof repairs are done. Under budget- total is \$9,500.

\* Set the parking lot repaying for June 10 and 11. Working on figuring out the best striping pattern. Martha asked about making the spots wider. Richard said we will lose a few to make the spots standard width.

\* Martha moved to have Executive Committee make the final decision on parking lot striping. Barbara seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

- \* Odor in second floor restrooms. Going to do a smoke test.
- \* Arson damage on church steps under tower. Hoping to re-paint it soon.

#### Treasurer:

- \* Revenue positives non pledgers were up, parking is up.
- \* Expenses shows a \$26,000 deficit through April, but included prepays including workers comp and property insurance.
- \* Choir line item had 2 months of pay, so wasn't actually over budget.
- \* Actually have a \$2,000 surplus as of end of April

\* Funeral Thursday for Jerry Divers

#### Outreach:

\* Committee met. Discussed Cinco de Mayo. Want to have more vegetarian and vegan options.

\* Operation Smart Start. Tentatively identified Dunbar Elementary but still evaluating options. Martha said Dunbar already has a church supporting them.

\* Boxes of Hope- suggestion not to use cardboard boxes and use barrels instead. Kerry Thatcher from Metropolitan Ministries offered to do a tour of the big tent. Could also volunteer as a group for distribution.

\* Next meeting Sunday, June 23 after 10:30 service

#### Homeless Ministry:

\* Numbers might be a little higher than usual. Started keeping track of numbers on paper. 120 on Friday. Friday is the highest day.

The meeting was adjourned at 5:54 pm.
