Reverently Speaking

Jesus said, "Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or what you will drink, or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothing? Look at the birds of the air; they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they? And can any of you by worrying add a single hour to your span of life?" —Matthew 6:25-27

Dear People of St. Andrew's,

Many of you have probably heard of the Dale Carnegie course. Some of you may be among the millions who have taken this course, which is based on Carnegie's techniques on "how to win friends and influence people." Really. It's a course for those in sales who have to do a lot of public speaking. It has proved to be useful and practical.

One of the Carnegie books used in the course has a rather intriguing title: *How to Stop Worrying and Start Living*. I am kind of the designated worrier in my family, so I am a bit leery of such a notion. I was trained from an early age to always run to the worst-case scenario in any situation, which is also a result of my natural pessimism. (You know the definition of a pessimist: an optimist with experience.) Worry served me well as a deputy sheriff, because I quickly learned that even apparently benign calls for service such as a complaint about a yapping dog could quickly lead to a frenzied neighbor ready to send barking Bowser to canine heaven with a little help from their friend, Mr. Winchester. So I learned to have contingency plans ready for even what appeared to be mundane calls. But I must admit that worry and fear have been a constant nagging pain in the neck. Even if my glass is 60% full, it's still 40% empty.

Dale Carnegie's book, however, offers some good advice. Basically, he advocates doing three things if you have a worry problem:

- + Ask yourself, "What is the worst that can possibly happen?"
- + Prepare to accept it, if you have to.
- + Then calmly proceed to improve on the worst.

That's the kind of advice a pessimist can grab, given that there's always something to worry about.

But while Carnegie's advice is good, it doesn't get at the root problem - our nagging anxiety. Jesus told us not to worry and yet it seems like many Christians are conditioned to do nothing else. We are an anxious people, easily stoked by fear in a culture that uses anxiety as a selling point for everything from politics to the food you buy in the grocery store. *(continued)*

It's no wonder, then, that you don't see much joy in Christianity; there's a lot more moralizing, complaining, criticizing and hand wringing. Instead of people of joy, we tend to be known as a cranky and anti-social lot. Clergy are burning out at an increasingly higher rate. Denominational meetings are conventions of pessimists. Churches are filled with religious consumers who jump from church to church based on what's in it for them. Gossip and backbiting fill parking lots and blog posts. We scramble to find ways to soothe our personal needs and desires. Joy is in short supply.

Based on Carnegie's book, it might be time for a Gospel reality check. If we believe in Jesus, then we have to remember that whatever worst-case scenario we can conjure up, the life, death and resurrection of Jesus from the dead means that it's already been handled. We need not even worry about the big one, death, because he's proven that even the big D has an expiration date. When we focus on the basics of that good news, we can begin to see that even the worst-case scenario isn't permanent, that I can accept it in the meantime, and that Christ gives me his Spirit to start improving on it in the present.

Maybe if we had a little more of that Gospel joy, we'd be a lot better at winning friends and influencing people!

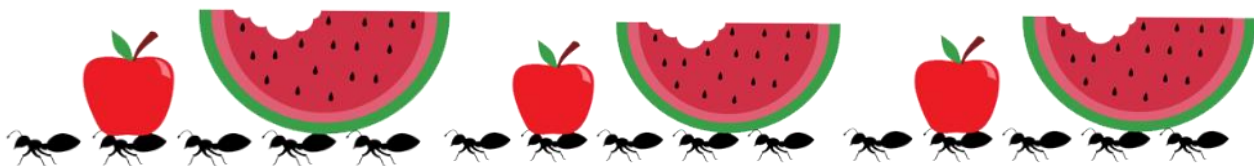
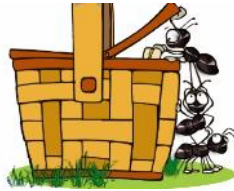

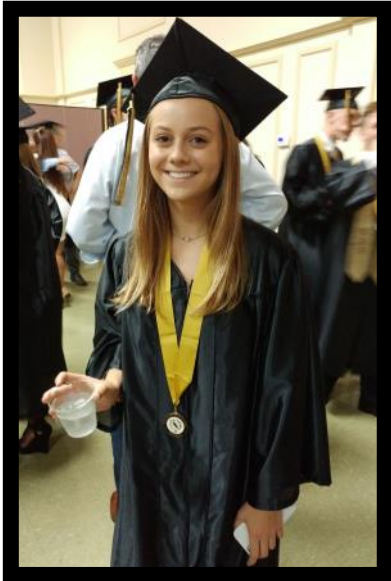


Parish Picnic

April Vestry Meeting Highlights

RECTOR'S REPORT:

- As of 4/18/17, there was \$201,927 in ops account. We have \$130,387 in the parish reserve account. There is \$78,501 in the Foundation's checking/CDs – monies available to the vestry (with \$53K of that designated to pay for painting of Parish Building and \$11K to pay for refurbishment of wall plaques in courtyard). We also have \$37,783 available from the Foundation principal as a result of the 2.25% spending allocation designated by the Foundation Board for 2015. We have another \$43,324 available from the Foundation principal as a result of the 2.5% spending allocation designated by the Foundation Board for 2016 at their meeting on 2/8/16. We have another \$53,473 available from the Foundation principal as a result of the 3% spending allocation designated by the Foundation Board for 2017 at their meeting on 2/21/17. And there was \$1,945,587 in the Foundation principal as of 3/31/17 (up \$80K from 12/31/16). There is also \$94K in the Dan Curtis fund *fbo* St. Andrew's within the Community Foundation of Tampa Bay, with \$8,070 in grant money available for 2017. (The Curtis fund is restricted to being spent on building maintenance. We are in the process of spending \$4,800 of those available funds to pay the roofer for the recent work on the south side of the church.)
- Bequest – A bequest of \$50,000 from the estate of Louise Lykes Ferguson will be arriving at St. Andrew's in the very near future. Mrs. Ferguson's will states that the bequest is to be used "as capital outlay or in support of the educational program for the Children's Sunday School." One option is to place this in our reserve fund and leave our options open for the future.
Irene Baker made a motion to place this money in reserve fund with Pam designating them as restricted under Ferguson bequest. Gary Cotter seconded, and with no further discussion the motion was unanimously approved.
- Organ tuning – Vestry approval needed to request Foundation to pay \$350 Heissler invoice.
Paula Stewart made a motion pay to pay Heissler the \$350 using Foundation funds. Brad Hall seconded and, after no discussion, the motion passed unanimously.
- Annual audits – Al and Brad have volunteered to chair (and form) the audit committee that will conduct internal audits of both the parish financials and the Foundation financials.
- Wednesday Evening Lenten Series – ran for five Wednesdays, 3/8 through 4/5. We had 25-30 each week. We had 15-18 at the 5:30 eucharist during that same time period. Alicia reported she had about 10 kids each week at the Wednesday evening kids' event that met at the same time as the adults.
- Bach Bash – was on Tuesday, 3/21 at 6:30PM. Very good attendance.
- Stations of the Cross – Fridays in Lent (3/3 through 4/14) at 12:10PM in the church. We averaged about 8 folks each week, except on Good Friday, when 42 turned out.
- Holy Week – services went well. The noon services were better attended than in the past.
- Easter Day – we had about 560 at the three services, which is our usual number. Many thanks to all who made it a great feast day, including musicians, acolytes, vergers, LEMs, and Parish Life folks who provided great food!
- Bishop's Visitation – Bp. Smith will be with us for the Feast of Pentecost on Sunday, 6/4. We will conduct confirmation class for youth and inquirers' class for adults in the spring in order to prepare folks for Dabney's visit. We will need Parish Life to host the coffee hour that day. *(continued)*

Brad Hall volunteered to head this committee.

SENIOR WARDEN'S REPORT – Jeff Coleman:

Jeff reported that Amy Ramirez is still working on the binders that will have details on each committee's duties. Mutual Ministry Review will be coming soon. Upper floor parish building buildout task force Visioning Program is scheduled for May 2, 2017, at 5:00 P.M. with Rob Glisson (architect from ROJO) and any interested parishioners. Jeff would like to do an inventory of the property to be included in the next audit. Jeff passed around thank you cards for signing and retreat presentation materials.

JUNIOR WARDEN'S REPORT – George Levy:

George reported that Gideon's Plumbing came out promptly on Easter Day to resolve the Parish Hall first floor restroom issues from Palm Sunday and Easter Day. (Various commodes were resurrected from water closet hell and given new life.) He will follow-up with suggestions for preventive maintenance. Roofers did an excellent job on the south wing of church. Four pews have been removed for termite infestation and treatment and will be returned Thursday, April 27th. We will continue with Pest Guard until the current jobs are completed, then start with Terminex for future work. The courtyard wall plaques are finished and awaiting the completion of the Parish Building south wall painting job. The primer portion of the job is well underway. George discussed the extra funds needed for exterior window cleaning of all windows in parish building.

Jeff Coleman made a motion to use \$2,200 from parish reserve fund to pay Leach for the window cleaning, Al Getz seconded and, after some discussion, the motion passed.

TREASURER'S REPORT – Gary Cotter:

Gary reported a couple of big payments that are paid quarterly went out, the property insurance and the pension payments.

OUTREACH REPORT – Loueita Hargens and Holly Clemmons:

Siete de Mayo plans going well. Parish Hall decorating for the event will be May 6. Deodorant will be the May request for KleanKits. April 30th is next Outreach meeting.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION – Jim Morgan:

Jim reports there are currently four confirmands. Need more adult volunteers for Sunday Children's Chapel.

HELPING HANDS - Irene Baker:

Irene got two more volunteers to help rotate the calendar for this committee.

New/Old Business — A thank you card for Dr. and Mrs. Smith for hosting the church picnic was passed around for signing. Lori Taplow has been sending letters to newcomers. There is a choir trip to the Dominican Republic scheduled for 2018. Loueita will take the lead on the Newcomers' Dinner and coordinate with Jeanette Reese. Dinner to be held at the Rectory. Fr. Reese allotted \$300 from the discretionary fund to be used for catering this event. Some suggestions were La Teresita, Affordable Caterers or some other pick-up food.

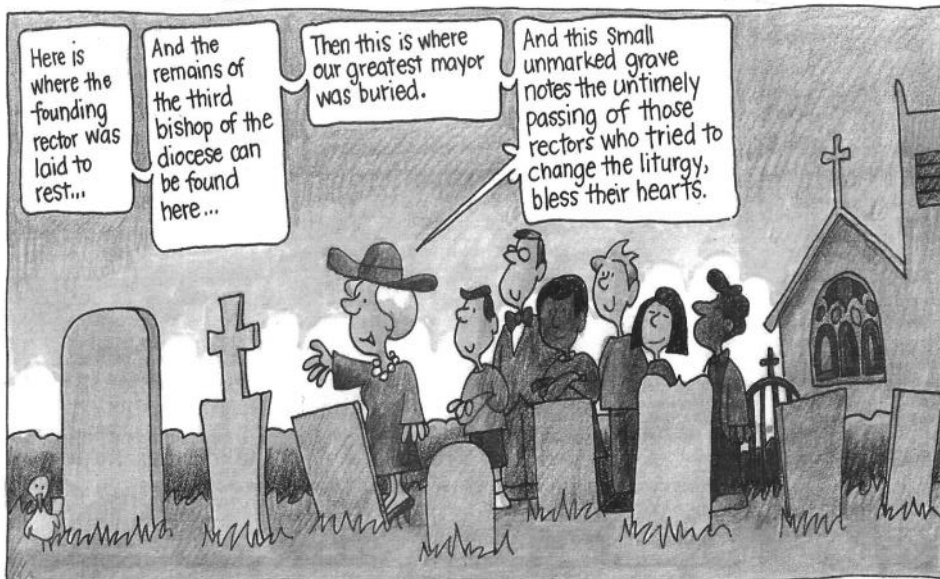
